Funda is a Zulu word, spoken by the people in South Africa. Long before there were books, the elders and griots and jaliyas – the storytellers – were the keepers of the culture; they passed on stories and songs so the community would learn its history and values. Rhode Island Black Storytellers will provide a program of stories and music celebrating the oral art and traditions of Black people of the African diaspora. FUNDA FEST will include African and Afro-Latino drummers and storytellers who share tales from Africa, Cape Verde, and the Americas, making cultural connections of African-descended people around the globe, and the stories we share.

Andy Kelly's Jazz Ambassadors will be highlighting the history of jazz, from its birth in New Orleans in the early 1900s to today, covering many of the greats, including Louis Armstrong, George Gershwin, Tommy Dorsey, and Herbie Hancock, among others. The band will loosely follow a chronological progression of jazz through the years, demonstrating and entertaining with each stylistic variation. Jazz is a uniquely American artform that is constantly evolving; this performance will help students connect the music of those bygone times to the jazz of today, as well as how to appreciate and understand this important, influential genre of music.

Left alone in the forest, Snow White discovers love and true friendship. This work features a collaboration between choreographer and Artistic Director Eva Marie Pacheco and composer Tony Lustig, with the talents of local professional dancers of Providence Ballet Theatre and members of the PBT's Jr. Company to create an all-new artistic experience for all ages. Beneath the visual treat of the ballet itself, this version of SNOW WHITE AND THE SEVEN DWARFS has an underlying theme, "let us not judge by outward appearances, the external beauty when not combined with inner goodness will eventually fade, and evil will be exposed".
