

PARKING SPECIFICATIONS

- The loading pad on pine street can hold ONE (1) CABLESS
 53' trailer, or ONE (1) tour bus.
- We can accommodate up to THREE (3) tour buses on Richmond Street through use of a traffic permit.
- Long term truck parking is available off exit 14B on I-95 south of Providence.
- The theater is NOT EQUIPPED WITH SHORE POWER

LOADING INSTRUCTIONS



Above is a potential loading plan- where the 40' bus is on the pad, circled in red, you can instead park another 53' trailer to be unloaded. The trailer circled in purple denotes the section of Pine Street which we close off for truck staging. That section stretches until Dorrance St., which can accommodate up to 5 trailers with cabs.

There are two doors through which to load through; the Stage Left Loading Door is accessible via the pad and is 8' Wide by 20' High. The Upstage Center Loading Door is accessible via Pine street and is 8' Wide by 10' High.

Our local union reserves the right to determine the need for and the use of our 2 forklifts, which have 6 foot forks, and have a weight capacity of 6,000 lbs.

There is some limited storage space in the basement if we backload a trailer with house equipment. Our freight elevator to send equipment down to the basement measures $5' \cdot 10'' \times 5' \cdot 10'' \times 8' \cdot 6''$ high.

POWER AND ELECTRICS

Stage Right Power (Automation and Lighting)

- Cam Lock, may require turnarounds
 - o 3x 400amp-3 Phase
 - o 3x 200amp-3 Phase
 - o 4x 100amp- 3 Phase

Stage Left Power (Audio)

- Cam Lock
 - 1x 200amp- 3 Phase, fed via 75kva isolation transformer

Front of House Hanging Positions

Two box booms are available on the Balcony House Left (Figure 1-A) and Balcony House Right (Figure 1-B). Each Boom contains 7 Horizontal Pipes with 2 and a half feet of space between each rung. Each side has 12 stage pin outlets per side. The Booms are 82' from the center of the plaster line.

The Balcony Rail (Figures 1-C and 1-D) has the capacity to hold various kinds of fixtures. In addition to the rail which runs the length of the mezzanine balcony, there is also a frame hanging underneath the mezzanine which holds our projector, though this can be swapped out for other hardware. The rail contains one permanent fixture, a camera used to provide a feed of the stage to the monitors in the lobby and backstage. The balcony rail has 24 stage pin outlets spanning its length. The rail is 66' from the stage.

House DMX is available at all Front of House positions and can be tied into on Stage Right.

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VIDEO SPECIFICATIONS

PROJECTORS

- PPAC is equipped with two 35mm film projectors, a Christie Xenolite SLH40, and a Simplex XL. These are both located in the Spotlight booth and are available for use upon request.




FIGURE 2-A: PROJECTOR FRAME AS SEEN FROM ORCHESTRA LEVEL

- We also have a digital projector in the form of a Panasonic PT-DZ21K2, which has two lens options, a D75LE20, and a D75LE10. We also have a Panasonic PTDZ870. Our digital projector hangs off of a schedule 40 cage hung underneath our mezzanine, as seen in Figure 2-A. This can be removed if your tour travels with its own projector.

SCREENS

- We have two (2) 11x17' Dalite Folding Screens, with a hanging kit or freestanding legs available for positioning.
- We also have a 9x16' Dalite screen, also equipped with a hanging kit or freestanding legs available as needed.
- Our Cyclorama (see soft goods inventory for specifications) can also be used as a full stage projection screen.

VIDEO SWITCHER AND ACCESSORIES

- We use a Roland VR-50 Multiformat Video Switcher
- A variety of HDMI, SDI, DVD, VGA, and other Adaptors are available upon request.

RIGGING AND SOFT GOODS

Rigging Specifications:

- Our rail is located on Stage Right
- There are 68 Line sets, with a single purchase counterweight system, set on 6" centers
- Each batten is 66' long
- The Arbor capacity is 1800 lbs.
- We have 40,000 lbs. of counterweight available
- The Pin Rails are located 30' off of the floor on both Stage Right and Stage Left
- 80 Spotting Sheaves and a corresponding multi-line are available
- We have a stacking motor located Upstage Right at our Grid Trap Door
- Grid Trap Door measures 39.5" x 70"

Soft Goods Inventory:

- 6 Pairs of Black Legs (10' Width x 30' Height)
- 5 Borders (66' Width x 10' Height)
- 2 Full Stage black out (composed of 4 traveler panels, 35' x 35')
- 1 White Cyclorama (60' Width x 30' Height)






FIGURE 4-A: STAGE W/FULL STAGE BLACK

DRESSING ROOM INFORMATION

- 4 Star Dressing Rooms, each equipped with bathroom and shower (one handicapped accessible shower in Dressing Room #3), well-lit makeup mirror, furniture, and mini-fridge. Star Dressing Rooms can typically accommodate up to 3 people per dressing room.
- 4 Principal Dressing Rooms, each equipped with bathroom and shower, well-lit makeup mirror, chairs, and mini-fridge. Principal Dressing Rooms can typically accommodate up to 6 people per dressing room.
- 2 Chorus Rooms, located downstairs from the other dressing rooms at the substage level, equipped with toilet and shower facilities, well-lit makeup mirrors, and chairs. Can accommodate up to 15 people each.
- 2 Production Offices which can accommodate up to 5 people with folding tables and chairs.
- All Dressing Rooms and Production Offices include power, paging systems, a show feed, and hardline internet ports.

LAUNDRY INFORMATION

PPAC is equipped with a dedicated wardrobe room and wig room, located next to the orchestra pit ramp at the substage level. See Figure 6-A for a picture of the wardrobe room, and 6-B for a picture of the wig room.

The washing machines and dryers, of which there are three (3) of each, are to be used only for personal laundry and not for any clothing which may be used on stage unless a member of IATSE Local 830, our local wardrobe union, is present.

Additionally, any of PPAC's own laundry equipment- steamers, clothing irons, ironing boards, presses, sewing machines, etc.- may not be used unless a member of IATSE Local 830 is present.

CATERING INFORMATION

Should catering be necessary for the show, the tour should provide notice to the theater as soon as possible, so that we may begin assembling a menu which fits your specific needs immediately. Our caterer is the catering staff of one of the country's premiere culinary institutes, Johnson and Wales University, and requires some notice before an engagement.

Load out meals for Broadways shows will be held in the Loew's Board Room on the 3rd floor (see Figure 7-A). For suitably long load outs, when a breakfast may be necessary, the breakfast meal will be provided in the lobby. Any other catered meals will likely be held backstage- these are typically taken in the wardrobe room, though other arrangements, such as the green room (see Figure 7-B), can be made upon request.

INFORMATION ABOUT OUR CBA

Being a union house, PPAC has a collective bargaining agreement (CBA) with the members of IASTE Chapter 23 to uphold certain standards which are necessary for working on the PPAC stage. Below are some (importantly, not all) of the conditions which may be relevant to your show when you come to perform here. Please contact the TD's office for further information on our CBA, or any questions you might have relating to the information therein.

General Information:

- No work may take place on stage unless IATSE Local 23 Stagehands are present
- Holidays are paid at twice the prevailing rate, and are defined as: New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Easter Sunday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day. Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve are not considered holidays until 3pm.
- Any filming or official photography entitles the union to an automatic additional minimum of 8 hours of pay.

Minimums:

- The minimum call for any call (Except for show work calls) is 4 employees (namely, the Head Carpenter, Head of Props, Head Electrician, and Head of Audio) for 4 hours regardless of actual time worked or crews necessary at the applicable hourly charge
- The minimum call for a performance call is the 4 heads
- Show work calls require two employees, comprised of the Head Electrician and at least one other head dependent upon the work being performed for a minimum of 4 hours
- Rehearsal calls require the head electrician to be present for a minimum of four hours

- Any service performed during a call beyond the minimum shall be rounded up to the nearest half hour for the purposes of determining pay
- Continuity Calls are paid in half hour increments of the prevailing rate and begin 10 minutes after the curtain falls on a performance. They do not have minimum hours or employees.

Overtime:

- Hours worked beyond 40 in a single week are paid at a rate of time and a half. All hours of work, regardless of call type or label, count towards this 40 hours.
- Any hours worked in excess of 8 hours on a single call shall be paid at a rate of time and a half.
- Any hours worked between midnight and 2am are paid at a rate of time and a half. Any hours worked between 2am and 8am are paid at a rate of double time. This includes when a call begins within this window.
- For yellow card shows, the first 8 hours of work in a single calendar day shall be paid at the applicable hourly rate regardless of call.

Meals:

- The Union receives a 15-minute coffee break between 2 and 2 ½ hours into the first call of the day. House policy is to allow a 10 minute wash up period before and after the coffee break.
- After 5 hours on any call, hands are entitled to a meal period of 1 hour, with a minimum of 2 hours worked thereafter on the same call. meal breaks should not be scheduled prior to three hours into the scheduled shift. Meal penalties apply if these conditions are not met, paid in half hour increments. If an unpaid meal break is not provided, a hot meal may be provided with a one-half hour paid break without incurring the meal penalty.




Re-entering the building: Employees will be permitted to re-enter the building after authorities deem the building safe. You should never re-enter an evacuated building unless given permission.


SEATING CHART
